Who should contact the Victim's Assistance Coordinator?

- A parent or guardian who has reason to believe his or her child has been sexually abused by a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Reno.
- Any person, who as a child, experienced sexual abuse by a priest, deacon, employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Reno.
- An individual who has reported allegations of sexual abuse as a minor and is having difficulty coping with feelings of anger and depression or experiencing other signs of emotional distress as a result of sexual abuse by a priest, deacon, employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Reno.

What to expect when contacting the Victim's Assistance Coordinator?

- You can expect a respectful, confidential consultation and interview with our Victim's Assistance Coordinator.
- The Diocese will notify civil authorities of the allegations in accordance with the requirements of the mandated reporter laws.

What will the Victim's Assistance Coordinator do?

- Assist you when deemed appropriate by the Diocese, and help you to obtain outpatient counseling from diocesan-recommended, licensed and qualified providers.
- Explore with you, as a pastoral outreach, financial resources for counseling costs.
- Arrange pastoral visits or meetings to aid in the healing process, which may include spiritual direction.
- Maintain contact with you to ensure that the counseling you receive is helpful.
- Provide other assistance as may be deemed appropriate by the Diocese.
